BUILDING AN EQUITABLE AND INCLUSIVE COMMUNITY, AT LADD

In 2018, LADD's Board created the Equity and Inclusion Committee. This Committee was charged with ensuring that LADD operated equitably and inclusively at every level of the organization. While we are strong advocates for inclusion throughout the community, we knew that our work was not simply about supporting others on their journey. To be authentic in our advocacy, and to be a better, stronger and more sustainable organization, we had to embark on our own journey as well.

The committee made the decision to first find a partner to help gather and assess data and discover what was working and what needed improvement at LADD. We took a year to gather data, through surveys, payroll data, and interviews. We developed benchmarks and made plans to move forward.

In 2020, during the pandemic, LADD launched, The LADD Way—a blue print for a more inclusive and equitable agency culture. We also made the decision to prioritize racial equity inside of LADD. Partly, this was due to the fact that we felt this is where we needed the most work in terms of representation, partly this was due to assessing our turnover numbers by race.

That said, LADD is a diverse agency. We are proud of our track record in supporting the LGBTQIA community and proud of our inclusive hiring practices related to disability. At LADD, we want both employees and people we support to come as you are, become who you feel you were meant to be and feel supported on your journey.

Still, we have a ways to go. Discomfort and growth have been hallmarks of our work this past year. Diversity, when done authentically, is synonymous with hiring and retaining the highest quality staff. When we hire quickly and don't take the time to expand the net, we miss out on exceptional candidates. Slowing down the process, opening positions up and taking time to develop and invest in our employees equitably results in excellence in service. We have a ways to go, but we are making progress.

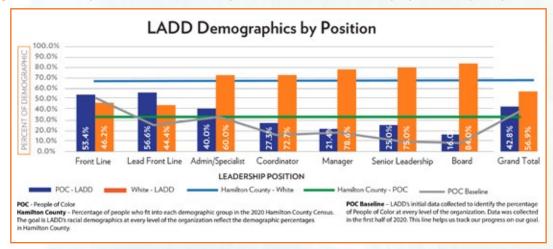

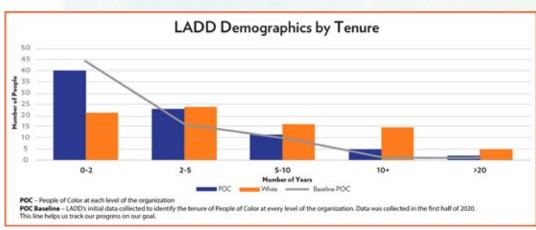
LADD'S EQUITY AND INCLUSION GOALS

LADD, at every level reflects the community in which we serve. Below is our progress on this journey:



- In 2019, 80% of LADD staff report "happiness" most or all of the time at work. However, only 20% of front line staff report they feel supported in career development. As part of the LADD Way work, we are assessing employee job descriptions to ensure they are comprehensive and arranging for them to be reviewed with the employees so everyone feels they know what is expected of them. The assessment also includes identifying and providing resources for career development to discuss with their managers.
- LADD has the best turnover in the field. However, our employees of color turnover faster than our white employees. Below is our progress in addressing this:

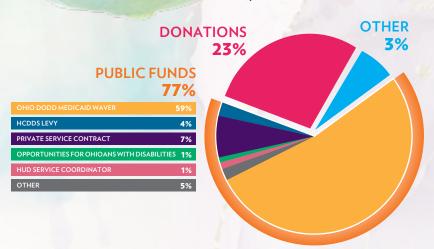
